T. 8 3. In vain we ask God's righteous law To jus - ti - fy us now; Since to convince and to condemn Is all the law can do.

B. 4. Je -sus, how glorious is Thy grace! When in thy name we trust; Our faith receives a right - eous-ness That makes the sin - ner just.
