As originally conceived, the semichorus of this arrangement of Rachmaninov's double choir setting of the Lord's Prayer is intended to be sung by a few voices from the main choir, who drop out from the chorus as necessary, returning at their earliest convenience.

It might instead be sung by a larger group, ignoring S&T/A&B markings, in which case, the version of the 2nd system at the foot of page 3 could be used. The semichorus should join the main choir for the final two systems.

Alternatively, the semichorus may be omitted.


