All people that on earth do dwell, Sing to the Lord with cheerful voice: Him serve with fear his praise forth tell, Come ye before him and re – joice.

This tune was called *Wells* from 1750. It has appeared, with a variety of words and arrangements, in several hundred tunebooks since 1722 (two every three years over that time); and in America since 1761. Notably, it appeared in *Kentucky Harmony* in 1816, *Wyeth's Repository of Sacred Music* in 1816, and Allen Carden's *Missouri Harmony* in 1820. It appeared in *The Sacred Harp* (page 28) from 1844 to the present, and *Southern Harmony* (page 278) from 1847, both with Isaac Watts' words, *Life is the time to serve the Lord*.
