21. Annie Laurie

"Annie Laurie" was a real person. born in 1682. daughter of Sir Robert Laurie. The words were written by Williamm Douglass as a tribute to Annie's beauty and an expression of his devotion to her. His original words, for the first two stanzas only, were in Scotch dialect, which have been rendered in the common version here printed. The music was written in 1847 by Lady John Scott who it is said, but not authoritatively, also wrtoe the words for the third stanza.
